

It was decided to record the live event, and make a CD and DVD. Musicians who had played on the early folk albums, those who had come in to record 'Jumble Lane' and 'Ode' and many others came from all over the UK and abroad.

The concert took place in the Music Salon, and rehearsal rooms were provided on the day, (5th May) for musicians to rehearse, many of whom had not seen each other for 30+ years.
